WHAT IS FESTULOLIUM?

Festulolium is the name for a hybrid forage grass developed by DLF through our breeding program crossing Meadow Fescue or Tall Fescue with Perennial Ryegrass or Italian Ryegrass.

Fescue-Type Festulolium varieties contribute qualities such as high dry matter yield, excellent winterhardiness, drought tolerance and persistence. **Ryegrass-Type Festulolium** is best suited as a short-lived forage stand with rapid establishment, good spring growth and excellent forage quality. The individual Festulolium varieties contain various combinations of these qualities, but all are substantially higher yielding than their parent lines.



The Festulolium Diamond shows the relationship between our Festulolium varieties and our Tall Fescue, Meadow Fescue, Perennial Ryegrass and Italian Ryegrass varieties. The closer a Festulolium variety is to one parent indicates what type of genetic background that variety may have the most of.

ON-FARM PERFORMANCE

Varieties with Hi-Gest® allow livestock to respond to the improved fiber digestibility and forage intake increases as expected when Hi-Gest forage is included in the ration. A high yield potential variety with Hi-Gest® Alfalfa Technology with improved fiber digestibility, intake and extent of digestion. A product of conventional plant breeding growers who focus on quality for their clients are being rewarded for preserving the identity of these higher performing lots of hay.

BALANCING YIELD AND QUALITY

Lignin is the complex organic compound that hardens and strengthens the plant's cell walls. In mature plants, **lignin increases yield, but negatively affects forage quality** and interferes with animal digestion. Through focused breeding Hi-Gest developed varieties offer high yield potential, a 5 - 10% increased rate of fiber digestion which improves animal intake; increased extent of fiber digestion (as measured by UNDF 240) by 5-10%, and raises crude protein of the forage by 3-5% when compared to other conventional varieties*. The net impact is higher testing, higher value hay which can mean 2.5 or more pounds of milk per cow per day when fed versus other varieties.
